Reading/CKLA <i>Stories</i>	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Students can retell familiar stories, including key details.2. Students can identify characters, settings, and major events in a story
Writing	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Students can draw a picture or write to answer a question about stories.2. Students can add details to their drawings.
Fundations <i>Unit 1</i>	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Students can recite a letter's name, keyword, and sound.2. Students can write the letters that they've learned with correct letter formation.
Math <i>Chapter 2 & Chapter 3</i>	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Students can identify whether the number of objects in one group is greater than, less than, or equal to the number of objects in another group, e.g., by using matching and counting strategies.2. Students can name, count, model, and write numbers from 6-9.
Science: Needs of Plants & Animals	Chapter 1: What do living things need to live and grow? Chapter 2: Why did two milkweed seeds become plants, but another did not? Chapter 3: Why did two milkweed plants that got water grow differently?
Social Studies <i>Unit 1: My School & Community</i>	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Students can identify people in their classroom and school community.2. Students can describe the rules in their classroom and school community.3. Students can understand why communities have rules.
